He combines passionate rhythm guitar with a powerful set of lungs, to create a unique style of entertainment. Rusty plays a subtle counterpunching role to Tesstle on acoustic guitar, mandolin and bass. These mates have broken the holy bread of music for over 20 years, butchering the chords, from Camperdown to St Arnaud, via Kinnabulla and Birchip. They have survived performing at school fetes, bikie shows, front bars, back bars, no holds barred, Folk Festivals, Churches, 70th Birthday shindigs and they have even supported ***Weddings Parties Anything!***
